

Our program is also looking for Range Aides

A range aide assists instructors with range activities. These include setting up range exercise cones, moving motorcycles, moving other equipment from the storage area to the range, changing out motorcycles if a problem arises and keeping the range area free of debris.

To become a Range Aide

You must have:

- A valid motorcycle license L or M
- Passed a state sponsored motorcycle rider course
- Ability to start all program motorcycles
- Ability to load and unload motorcycles from the storage area and move motorcycles to and from the range
- Ability to set up exercise cones
- Ability to gas and air motorcycles
- Willingness to work weekends and week nights

What salaries do Range Aides receive?

Range Aide salaries average \$160.00 for a 16 hour Basic Rider Course.

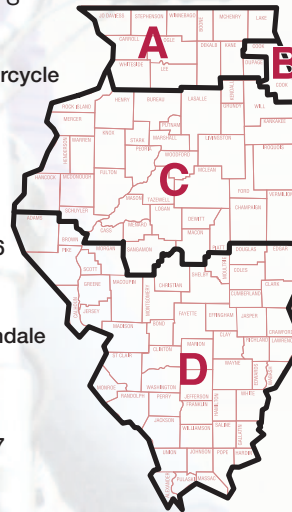

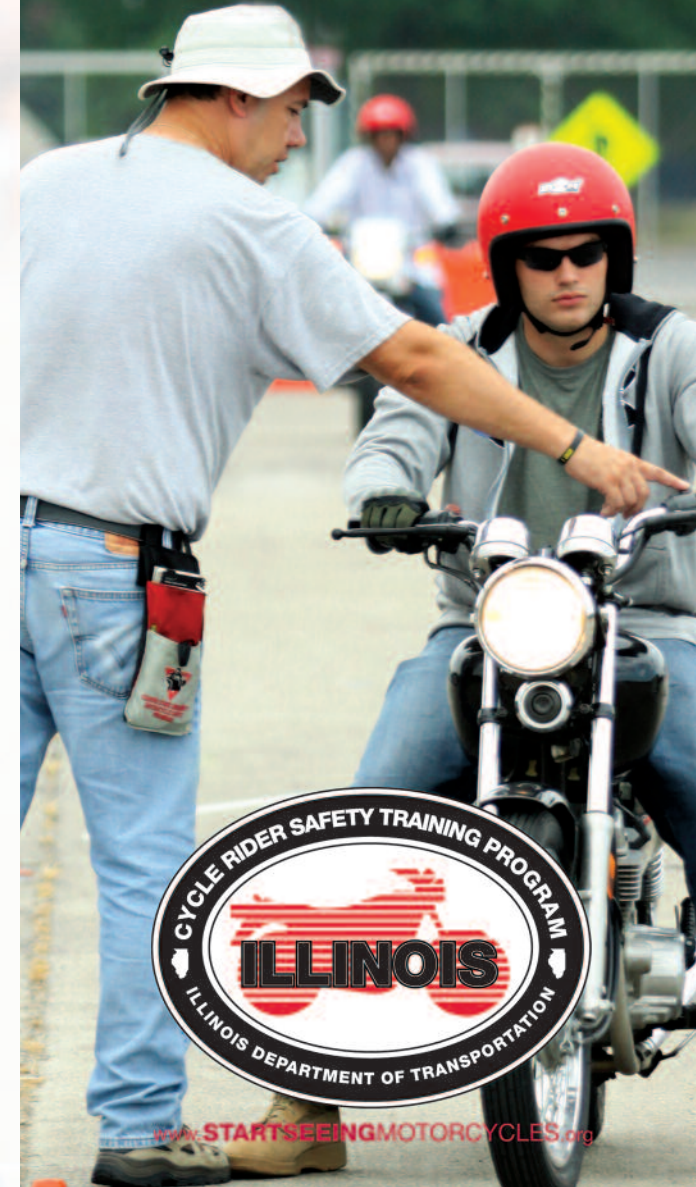

ILLINOIS IS LOOKING FOR MOTORCYCLE INSTRUCTORS



Illinois is looking for Motorcycle Instructors!

The Illinois Cycle Rider Safety Training Program is looking for additional instructors. Over 20,000 novice and experienced students receive instruction each year. You can be part of providing this program at one of approximately 60 training locations around the state.

We are looking for instructors who have:

- Patience
- Excellent communication and written skills
- Excellent social skills with a strong interest in helping others from diverse backgrounds
- Enthusiasm for the sport
- Currently own and operate a motorcycle
- Willingness to teach weekends and week nights

What is the cost?

There is no charge for the Instructor Preparation Course, however, a refundable registration deposit may be required. Contact your local Regional Center for more information. An Instructor Guide and course-related materials will be provided. You will be expected to attend and successfully complete the entire 60+ hour course. Accepted applicants are responsible for their own travel costs and extensive pre-course preparation.

Instructor Preparation Course information

The Instructor Preparation (IP) Course is designed to train experienced motorcyclists to teach the Basic Rider Course. The IP Course is open to recent graduates of the Basic Rider Course who have excellent verbal and written communication skills and enjoy working with people.

To successfully complete this course you must pass the Instructor Skills Test, a knowledge test and student teaching. Graduates of the IP Course receive Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) certification and are eligible to teach the Basic Rider Course in Illinois.

What will I learn in the Instructor Preparation Course?

Under the supervision of a Chief Instructor, you will learn how to teach the Basic Rider Course curriculum, with special emphasis on such skills as evaluation, coaching, range management and classroom teaching techniques.

How often will I teach?

Most instructors average four to six courses each year. Some teach over thirty courses during the training season. You must teach a minimum of two courses during your two year MSF certification.

Where will I teach?

There are approximately 60 training sites in Illinois. You determine where and when you are available to teach.

What salaries do Instructors receive?

Instructor salaries average from \$385 to \$400 per course statewide. This includes the 20 hours of scheduled instruction, plus any set up and take down time.

When and where will the Instructor Preparation Course take place?
